The Truth about Sex Education: What's Actually Taught and When



The Future of Sex Education (FoSE) initiative—a partnership of Advocates for Youth, Answer, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, and SIECUS: Sex Ed for Social Change—believes that sex education should include a wide variety of age-appropriate social, mental, and sexual health topics, which build on each other like blocks as kids go through K-12 education. Here's what that can look like.
